

General Information About Financial Assistance

The Trumbull Career & Technical Center Education Association provides some financial assistance for qualifying junior students. In order to be considered for these funds, the following rules must be followed.

1. Student will fill out an application during the third week of October. All information within this application must be completed or the applicant will not be considered.
2. Funds will be released to the Trumbull Career & Technical Center only after the student has paid 50% of his/her program fees.
3. Financial Assistance will be granted without regard to sex, race, handicap, or creed.
4. Verification of financial need is required. The student's parent(s) must supply verification of need by submitting one of the following: copy of W-2; statement from the TCTC that the student qualifies for free/reduced lunch; or statement verifying public assistance.
5. Attendance must be at least 90% during the first nine weeks at the TCTC. This generally means that a student cannot miss more than 4 days during the first grading period.
6. At the end of the first grading period, any student receiving a failing grade in any subject will become ineligible for assistance.
7. Junior students that qualify for assistance will have 50% of their program fees paid. This amount will not exceed \$100 per student. This assistance is only for junior students, not seniors.

Applications are processed after the first nine week period and students are given letters in November that state whether they do or do not qualify for this assistance. Applications will be ready by mid October and students can pick them up at the student finance office, guidance office, or from Mrs. Ghindia.
