about the program...

brief overview

Job Training is a diverse and individualized transition program provided for young adults between the ages of 16 to 22. Many of these students may have special needs. The Job Training Program is available in two sections. Job Training I is called the Opt 4 Cite Program which is a collaboration between the Trumbull County Board of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities' Fairhaven Program, the Trumbull Career and Technical Center, and Kent State University Trumbull Campus. It provides students with a foundation on which to acquire basic employability skills. Opt 4 Cite Job Training I students are half time at their home school for academics and half time at the TCTC job training site at KSU Trumbull Campus. Job Training II is available for students (18-22) who have delayed taking their diplomas to improve employability, attitudinal, technical, and other skills. Students are placed in job training sites and/or paid employment. Job Training can help bridge the transition between school and competitive employment.
