

## TCTC After School AFJROTC Course

**Course Description:** This course is an Air Force JROTC Course offered to 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade students whose home high schools are part of the TCTC consortium of high schools. This course is one academic year in length and will focus on elements of the First Year AFJROTC curriculum from Aerospace Science, Leadership Education, Drill and Physical Education. This course is offered as a for-credit course on a pass fail basis with attendance and class participation being the determining factors for the pass/fail grade.

### Grading:

The course will be graded on a pass fail basis. Students must attend and participate in 65% or more of the available classes in order to earn a passing grade.

### Program Mission, Goals, and Objectives

The **mission** of the AFJROTC program is to develop citizens of character dedicated to serving their nation and community.

The **goals** of the program are to instill values of citizenship, give service to the United States, develop a personal responsibility, and instill a sense of accomplishment in high school students.

The **objectives** of AFJROTC are to educate and train high school cadets in citizenship; promote community service; instill responsibility, character, and self-discipline; and provide instruction in air and space fundamentals.

### Program Benefits

1. Advanced grade in the armed forces. If the student chooses to enlist in any branch of the military the student receives advanced grade and pay for their time in Air Force JROTC.
2. Opportunities for senior ROTC and military academy scholarships. Students get special looks at these because of their familiarity.
3. Up to 16 college credits through the University of Colorado, Colorado Springs.

Students are under **no obligation to military service** if enrolled in the Air Force JROTC program. The program is designed to help make the student successful in whatever career path they choose.

### Field Experiences

We believe that field experiences are essential to understanding and meeting course objectives. Some of the field experiences our students have participated in are: a C-130 flight, tours of the Newton Falls Guard Facility, the Cleveland Coast Guard Station, Washington D.C. and Wright-Patterson Air Force Base. We also attend several drill competitions each year.

### Community Service

Students identify opportunities for community service and then plan, organize and carryout the community service event. These events are crucial to meeting the mission of AFJROTC.

### Classroom rules.

I like to keep this area simple. Act professionally at all times. No sleeping, cursing, horsing around, cheating or plagiarism, etc. Simply put, abide by the student code of conduct.
